Space and infrastructure	We have high speed reliable wifi freely available to all our members, including the entrepreneurs on the programme. Would the entrepreneur have a free space all day in the center? Only some hours a day? What are the timetables? Entrepreneurs will have a Hub 100 membership, which means they can use the co-working space for a total 100 hours during the month. We are open Monday to Friday from 8am until 9pm, and within these times the enterprises will have access. In addition, the enterprises would be able to attend events and trainings that wo offer to our members, and these be in addition to the 100 hours.		
Networking with local entrepreneurs	 Networking is a core part of what we offer to enterprises. We do this in a number of ways: Holding regular events for our community of entrepreneurs. Our visiting enterprises will be able to attend at least four of these – breakfast, lunch, tea and happy hour, where we provide food and drink and invite enterprises to meet and network. Holding facilitated networking events: depending on the timing of the visit, enterprises will be able to attend our successful facilitated networking events, based on introductions and referrals and the principle of '6 degrees of separation'. Making individual introductions. Impact Hub prides itself on the way we actively 'host' our members, including facilitating connections between our members and to those outside the Impact Hub. Impact Hub King's Cross has 350 members, and Impact Hubs throughout London have 1000+ members in total, so we have good access to enterprises Themed events: We hold regular events of interest to enterprises, including those with a specialist field (ethical fashion, sustainable food), business issues (sales, franchising, investment) or management and leadership (managing failure, team building) and enterprises get to know one another around these common interests 		

Networking with other local agents	Impact Hub King's Cross is well-connected in the enterprise, and specifically social enterprise field. We hold regular speed-dating style events where we introduce entrepreneurs to up to 10 finance providers in one evening (including equity, loan, crowdfunding and tech specialists).

	London is an international city, with a lot of interesting events that promote both business and social inte- gration. Impact Hub members based in London are themselves from diverse international communities and social events are often organised by our members both at the Impact Hub and beyond.
	In addition, we have a community event each week for business and personal networking: breakfast, lunch tea or happy hour, where entrepreneurs get to know one another.
	The entrepreneurs are also welcome to take part in other Impact Hub organised events for our members trainings, etc as described above.

ls there any assistance in finding accommodation?	We don't directly work on finding accommodation. However, our members sometimes use the London members listserve list to share details of flatshare or accommodation needed, and we could help the enter- prises to access this.
